STANDING ORDER NO. 1 OF 1969

SUB: DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION OF DIRECTLY RECRUITED PROBATIONER SUB-INPECTORS OF POLICE AND PROSECUTING SUB-INPECTORS OF POLICE ON COMPLETION OF DISTRICT PRACTICAL TRAINING.

In the light of the Rajasthan Police Sub-ordinate Service Rules, 1966 and the Rajasthan Civil Service (Departmental Examination) Rules, 1958, it has been decided to introduce a departmental examination of probationary Sub-Inspectors of Police and Prosecuting Sub-Inspectors of Police, appointed as a result of combined competitive examination by direct recruitment through open market, on completion of their Practical Training in the Districts. The probationary Sub-Inspectors and Prosecuting Sub-Inspectors would be ~~xxxxxxxxxx~~ eligible for confirmation only after they pass this departmental examination. The syllabus and Courses of the said departmental examination for Sub-Inspectors and Prosecuting Sub-Inspectors is specified in Appendix 'A' and 'B' respectively.

2. The Board consisting of a Deputy Inspector General of Police, (AS CHAIRMAN), Assistant Inspector General of Police and a Superintendent of Police, as may be nominated by the Inspector General of Police will conduct the departmental examinations and declare result after getting it approved from the Inspector General of Police. The examination will be held at the Police Headquarters or at such place or places as may be determined by the Examination Board with prior approval of the Inspector General of Police.

3. A trainee-officer who fails to get pass marks only in one paper in the examination may take this

examination again in the paper only at the subsequent examination held. A trainee-officer who fails to get pass marks in more than one paper shall take the examination anew.

4. T.A./D.A. for journey to the place of examination will be allowed for the first and second attempts only.

5. In case of trainee officer fails to get through the examination even in three attempts, he will be considered by the Inspector General of Police, fit or unfit from service on grounds of unfitness.

6. A trainee-officer abs-tting himself from the examination without permission from the Inspector General of Police will be considered to have failed at the examination for the purposes of confirmation.

7. A trainee-officer who either at the time of examination or subsequently is found using unfair means or practices for passing or attempting to pass the examination, will be considered by the Board and the report sent to the Inspector General of Police for such action as he may deem fit.

### III. Paper on Practical Performance.

#### A.) Scrutiny of cases:

Cases files scrutinised by the candidates during his training period will be seen.

#### B. Scrutiny of General Diaries (Rajnamcha).

Entries in General Diaries (Rajnamcha) written by the candidate and the comments and scrutiny made by him on entries in General Diaries will be seen.

#### C. Scrutiny of Registers at Police Stations:-

The trainee officers will show the scrutiny of the registers maintained at the Police Stations during his training. They may be asked to give nature of general defects in the maintenance of Registers.

#### D. Personal investigation by Candidates:-

The trainee officers would produce for inspection the investigation files of five cases investigated independently by them.

N.B. : All the above will be periodically judged by the Supdt. of Police under whom the officer is trained and detailed remarks will be entered in the working diary of the candidate.

At the assessment only investigation files will be seen and the rest will be assessed from the remarks in his working diary.

### III. PAPER ON PRACTICAL PERFORMANCE.

In this paper the practical performance of the candidate during his practical training will be judged with special reference to his work about cases preparation of briefs there maintenance of record at P.S.I./P.I. office etc. etc.

#### A) Scrutiny of cases and Preparation of brief.

Case files would be supplied for scrutiny, preparation of brief and comments.

#### B) Scrutiny of Registers at P.I./P.S.I. Office.

The trainee officers will be asked to scrutinised the registers maintained in P.I./P.S.I. office. They may be asked to give nature of general defects in their registers - maintenance of.

#### C) Preparation of Acquittal Notes.

The trainee officers will be supplied case file, copy of judgement and judicial notes and asked to prepare an acquittal note.

#### D) Personal conducting of prosecution by candidates.

The trainee officers would produce for inspection the copies of judicial notes and order sheets of 5 cases conducted by him alongwith the concerned investigation files.

N.B.:- All the above(except item D)will be periodically judged by the Supdt. of Police under whom the officer is trained and detailed remarks will be entered in the working diary of the candidate.

At the assessment only copies of judicial notes and order sheets of 5 cases conducted by the candidates alongwith the concerned investigation files, will be seen and the rest will be assessed from the remarks in his working diary.
