### **ORDER**

Sub: Guidelines for surveillance, containment and caution for the period uptoFebruary28<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

Vide Order No.40-3/2020-DM-I(A) dated January 27, 2021, Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), Government of India has issued Guidelines for **surveillance**, **containment and caution** for the month of February, 2021. The need of the hour is to continue to maintain the same vigilance against spread of COVID-19. Every citizen should maintain due caution and strictly follow the prescribed strategy, focused on surveillance, containment and strict observance of the guidelines.

After taking into account the prevailing COVID outbreak scenario in the State, the following Guidelines are hereby issued for maintaining caution and strict surveillance in the State of Rajasthan uptoFebruary28<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

### A. SURVEILLANCE AND CONTAINMENT ZONES:

- 1. If required, Containment Zones shall be carefully demarcated and notified by the **District Collector & District Magistrate** concerned, at the **micro level**, after taking into consideration the guidelines prescribed by MHA/MoHFW in this regard.
- 2. Within the demarcated Containment Zones, strict **containment measures**, as prescribed by MoHFW, shall be scrupulously followed.
  - i. **Quick isolation** of COVID-19 patient shall be ensured in treatment facilities/home (subject to fulfilling the **home isolation guidelines**).
  - ii. Medical department will share list of all CO+VE cases (with address and mobile details) with concerned SHO every day for monitoring purposes by Beat Constable. Beat Constable will download RajCovidInfoapp to monitor the CO+VE cases. He will visit at least once in three days to ensure that the patient remains home

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- quarantined and also get **RajCovidInfo**app downloaded on mobile phone of CO+VE patients.
- iii. Awareness shall be created in communities on COVID-19
  Appropriate Behavior.
- iv. It shall be the responsibility of local district, police and municipal authorities to ensure that the prescribed Containment measures are strictly followed. District Collectors & District Magistrates shall ensure accountability of the officers concerned in this regard.
- v. Prohibitory orders u/s 144 CrPC will be issued by the concerned district authority.

### **B.** LOCAL RESTRICTIONS:

- 1. TheGovernment of India has issued a comprehensive SOP document on January 22<sup>nd</sup> 2021 for managing the COVID-19 issues in the context of KumbhMela. As per the SOP outlined by GoI, the committee constituted by order dated 8<sup>th</sup> June 2020 may take suitable steps to organize various Melas and Fairs in consultation with the State Government.
- 2. District Collector & District Magistrates based on their assessment of situation may impose **local restrictions**, with a view to contain the spread of COVID-19, after **prior permission** of the State Government.
- 3. District Collectors & District magistrates also need to enforce social distancing in offices.
- 4. The **District Collector & District Magistrate** shall not impose any local lockdown (District/sub-division/City/villagelevel), outside the containment zones, without **prior permission** of the Government.

# C. IN AREAS OUTSIDE THE CONTAINMENT ZONES:

- (i) The State Government has decided to open government and private schools, Higher Education institutions (colleges and universities), coaching institutions, Medical, Dental, Nursing and Para Medical colleges as per following conditions:-
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  - a. Online/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged.

- b. All government and private schools have been permitted to open for regular class studies for classes 9th to 12th. Classes for 6th to 8th are permitted to open from 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021.
- c. Classes for 1st to 5th will remain closed till further order.
- d. All Universities and Colleges of the state have been also permitted to open for **final year** students.Regular classes for all other students are allowed to open from 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021.

For regular classes all government and private institutions will compulsorily follow the SOP issued by the Education Department. For regular class studies the seating arrangements for students would be made in such a way that the total present students are not more than 50% of the seating capacity of the room. All schools/colleges and Coaching Institutions will strictly follow the SOPs issued from time to time by Ministry of Home Affairs, Health and Family Welfare and Education Ministry of Government of India. These would also follow the directions issued by the Home Department, Medical and Health Department and Education Department of the State Government.

### D. FUNCTIONS/GATHERINGS:-

Functions and other congregations will be permitted in areas outside the Containment Zonesas follows:

# (i) Marriage related gathering:

Where the organizer shall:

- a. Give prior information to the concerned Sub-divisional Magistrate, preferably on email.
- b. Ensure social distancing during the function.
- c. Ensure mandatory wearing of Face masks. 'No Mask No Entry' will be strictly followed.
- d. Ensure **Screening & Hygiene**: Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common area.

Ensure **Frequent sanitization** of common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. railings, door handles etc.

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- f. Ensure that the maximum number of guests allowed shall not be more than 200.
- (ii) Funerals/last rites related gatherings with mandatory wearing of face masks, social distancing provision for hand wash or sanitizer, and the maximum number of persons allowed shall not be more than 20.
- (iii) Social/ political / sports / entertainment /academic / cultural / religious functions /gathering, subject to the following conditions:

The organizer shall:

- 1. Give prior information to the concerned District Magistrate/Police Commissioner, along with a seating plan, preferably on email.
- 2. ensure that maximum number of guests allowed shall not be
  - a. In closed spaces, a maximum of 50% of hall capacity will be allowed, with a ceiling of 200 persons.
  - b. In open spaces, keeping the size of the ground/space in view with a ceiling of 200 persons. Each person shall maintain a **distance of 6 feet (do gaz-ki-doori).**
- 3. ensure social distancing during the function.
- 4. ensure mandatory wearing of face masks. 'No Mask No Entry' will be strictly followed.
- 5. ensure **Screening & Hygiene**: Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.
- 6. Ensure **Frequent sanitization of seats**, common facilities and all **common** points which come into human contact such as railings, door-handles, common surfaces, floors, etc.

Violation of any of the above conditions is an offence and punishable with heavy fine.

# E. STRICT ADHERENCE TO THE PRESCRIBED SOPS FOR PERMITTED ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE THE CONTAINMENT ZONES:

1. All **other activities** have been **permitted** outside Containment Zones, except for following, which have been permitted with certain restrictions:

- i. International air travel of passengers, as permitted by MHA.
- ii. Cinema halls/theatres/multiplexes, and similar places are permitted to open from 8<sup>th</sup> Februaryupto 50% of capacity, subject to SOP issued by Ministry of Information & Broadcasting in consultation with MHA.
- iii. **Swimming pools**, are allowed to open from 8<sup>th</sup> February 2021 subject to SOP issued by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports (MoY A&S) in consultation with MHA.
- iv. **Exhibition halls**, are allowed to open from 8<sup>th</sup>February 2021, subject to SOP issued by the Department of Commerce in consultation with MHA. (a maximum of 50% of hall capacity will be allowed, with ceiling of 200 persons)
- 2. **SOPs** have been prescribed for various permitted activities. For ease of reference, the list of activity wise SOPs with their web-links will be available on *covidinfo.rajasthan.gov.in*.
- 3. The SOPs shall be strictly enforced by the authorities concerned, who shall be responsible for their strict observance.

### F. COVID APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR:

District Collectors & District Magistrates shall take all necessary measures to promote COVID-19 appropriate behaviour, such as ensuring strict enforcement of wearing of face mask, hand hygiene and social distancing.

- 1. Wearing of face masks is an essential preventive measure. In order to enforce this core requirement. Action including imposition of appropriate fines, on persons not wearing face masks in public and work spaces must be ensured.
- Observance of social distancing in crowded places, especially in markets, weekly bazaars and public transport, is also critical for containing the spread of infection. SOP to regulate crowds in market places, shall be strictly enforced.
- 3. **SOPs** for regulating travels in public transports such as aircrafts, trains, metro rails, buses shall be strictly enforced.
- 4. **Common Safety Directives** for COVID-19 Management shall be strictly followed throughout the State.

# G. COMMON SAFETY DIRECTIVES FOR COVID-19 MANAGEMENT:

The following **common SAFETY directives** shall remain **applicable** for all areas and all districts:

#### 1. IN PUBLIC SPACES:

The following precautions, being essential for public safety, are mandatory and violation of the same shall be punishable.

- (1) Face Covering: Wearing of face cover is compulsory in all public and work places and during transport.
- (2) **Social distancing:** Each person shall maintain a distance of 6 feet "do-gaz-ki-doori") in public places.
- (3) **Spitting in public & work places** is **prohibited** and punishable with fine.
- (4) Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco etc. in public place is prohibited and punishable with fine.
- (5) All persons are advised to wash hands with soap & water/use sanitizer after touching any surface that is in public contact.

### 2. AT WORK PLACES:

In addition to above, the following additional safety precautions are prescribed for WORK PLACES (Offices, Establishments, Factories, Shops etc.):

- (1) Work from home (WfH): As far as possible, the practice of work from home should be followed.
- (2) Staggering of work/business hours will be followed in offices, work places, shops, markets and industrial and commercial establishments.
- (3) **Screening & Hygiene**: Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas.
- (4) Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact eg. door handles etc. shall be ensured, including between shifts.
- (5) Social Distancing: All persons in charge of work places shall ensure social distancing between workers, through adequate

distance between workers, adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff etc.

(6) Intensive communication and training on good hygiene practices shall be taken up.

The District Magistrate and other authorized officers shall enforce Common Safety Directives, as stated above, through fines and penal action as prescribed in the Disaster Management Act, 2005/The Rajasthan Epidemic Diseases Act, 2020.

**3. SHOPS:-**In addition to 1 and 2 above, adequate physical distancing among customers will be ensured in the shops. 'No Mask No Service' i.e. No sale shall be made by the shopkeeper to any customer who is not wearing a Face Mask.

### H. USE OF AAROGYA SETU

Use of AarogyaSetu may continue on best effort basis on compatible mobile phones. This will facilitate timely provision of medical attention to those individuals who are at risk.

### I. SAFETY ADVISORY FOR VULNERABLE PERSONS:

Vulnerable People (Persons aged 65 and above, Persons suffering from Chronic diseases/co-morbid conditions, Pregnant women and Children below 10 years) are strongly advised to **stay at home** and move out only for essential and health purposes. However, if they move out of home, it is most essential that they exercise utmost safety precautions as specified.

# J. MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE/TRANSPORT/PASSES:

- (i) There shall be **no restriction on inter-State and within State movement of persons and goods.** No separate permission/approval/e-permit will be required for such movements.
- (ii) All commercial passenger transport vehicles (bus, taxi, cab aggregators (OLA/Uber etc.) auto rickshaw, cycle rickshaw) are also permitted to ply subject to ensuring proper sanitization of the seats and touch points before and after each journey and other safety precautions prescribed.
- (iii) Public (City) Transport, Metro Rail will be allowed to operate as per SOP issued.

- (iv) The passengers travelling in any vehicle (personal or commercial) shall not exceed the permitted seating capacity of the registered vehicle.
- (v) Movement by passenger trains and domestic passengers air travel etc. will continue to be regulated by the SOPs issued by MHA, Government of India.

### K. IMPLEMENTATION MODALITIES

The implementation modalities shall be the same as per the Order of even number dated March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020.
